Stay at Klahoose Lodge

Canada



For an ultimate unique experience, extend your trip with a 3-night stay at a remote Klahoose Lodge in Northwest British Columbia.

Klahoose Wilderness Resort is a 6,100- square foot timber-built wilderness lodge in Desolation Sound, only accessible by water. The resort has different room types, each with a maximum occupancy of up to 4 people. Facilities include a 3-piece washroom (toilet, sink and shower). Wi-Fi Internet access is available in the main building only (connection is very intermittent due to the resort's remote location). There are no televisions or radios in the rooms. The resort boasts a series of large decks and sitting areas overlooking the water, wood sauna, as well as indoor sitting areas and lounges. All rooms have ocean view.

The resort is located in the traditional toq qaym̓x^w (Klahoose Nation) territory. Guests take part in authentic experiences led by Indigenous guides and cultural interpreters.

Due to its spectacular location, the Klahoose Wilderness Resort is a prime spot to see Grizzly Bears and Black Bears. In the spring, guests can see both types from boats as the bears feed near estuaries and along beaches. In the autumn, grizzlies can be seen from viewing platforms overlooking rivers filled with spawning salmon. Not only that, but guests can also see Humpback Whales, Orca, Dolphins, and Eagles in this ocean and rain forest paradise.

Arrival day:

Located north of British Columbia's Sunshine Coast in Desolation Sound. To get here take a scheduled or charter plane from Vancouver to Powell River (35 minutes) or direct to the dock or drive to Lund and meet the resort's boat transfer. Upon arrival, meet your hosts and have an opportunity to review your activities for the next several days. Afterwards, take some time to get settled and explore the amenities and comforts of the resort before dinner. Dinner included. Overnight at Klahoose Wilderness Resort.

DURING YOUR STAY –

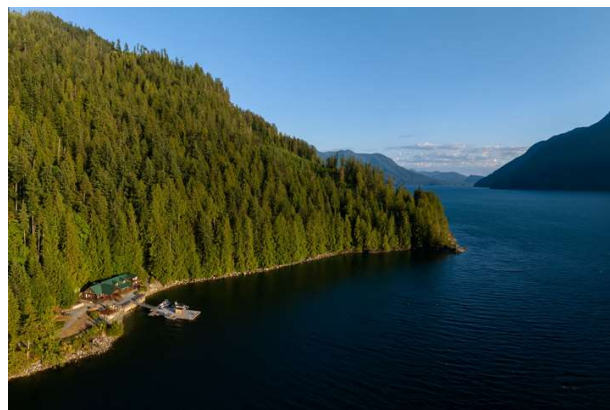
Over the next several days, prepare yourself for an experience unlike any other. Embark on several adventures and transformational experiences that may include watching grizzly bears fish for salmon, kayaking beside a pod of porpoises and forest hikes into an ancient western red cedar grove.

Inlets of the Desolation Sound are famous for one of the most robust populations of grizzlies in the world. From August 24 to October 15, Klahoose First Nation will take guests on a fascinating bear watching experience in Toba Inlet located just 30 minutes by boat from the Klahoose Wilderness Resort. Grizzly Bear viewing is from fixed viewing platforms set along the remote Klite River in Toba Inlet.

From May to August, Indigenous guides lead guests on nature and cultural excursions in one of the largest temperate rainforests on earth and to nearby Cortes Island where the Klahoose community resides. Sea kayakers, stand-up paddle boarders and intrepid swimmers can take advantage of the glassy waters of the Homfray Channel. Traditional canoe and fishing excursions can also be arranged upon request. Helicopter sightseeing tours over glacial and wildflower fields are also available (at additional cost, payable onsite). During these days, delicious meals are served at the resort, masterfully fusing local ingredients with exquisite preparation. The amenities of the resort are also available to all guests, allowing you to create a quiet escape of your own. All meals included.

Departure Day –

After breakfast, enjoy a final morning at the resort before being transferred by boat to Lund for an independent departure by your car or a pre-booked transfer to Powell River airport. Breakfast included.

Packages can be booked for 3 or 4 nights.

GENERAL INFORMATION – PLEASE ENSURE YOU READ THE FOLLOWING

Passports: Please ensure these are valid for travel and that you are in possession of valid visas (if required see below). You are required to take out comprehensive travel insurance to safeguard against cancellation and curtailment, medical expenses, repatriation expenses, damage/theft/loss of personal baggage, money and personal belongings.

Visas: Not required for Canada for UK or EU nationals for stays of up to 90 days. An onward or return ticket is required, as well as sufficient funds and documents needed for further travel. Please note that visitors to Canada must have a MINIMUM of two blank/empty VISA pages in their passport each time entry is sought. Visitors to Canada with foreign passports who do not comply with these requirements will either be stopped from boarding their aircraft at their point of departure or risk deportation on arrival in Canada.

Health: All travellers should seek advice from their local GP or travel clinic for up-to-date advice on vaccinations and different malarial options. Travel insurance is part of the Terms and Conditions of your trip with Native Escapes it is essential that you purchase comprehensive travel insurance for your trip. Your insurance should be inclusive of full medical cover including costs of emergency repatriation, cancellation and travel delay.

Native Escapes complies with the UK Package & Travel Regulations 1992. Holidays with flights included are covered by the company's ATOL Bond (Air Travel Organisers' Licence) held by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA). This means that in the unfortunate event that our company should fail, the CAA will arrange any necessary repatriation and any refund of monies paid to Native Escapes in advance.
